

 - Water Allocation



Foresight

- Wild spaces are natural resources
- Conservation of public places, fish, and wildlife

President Theodore Roosevelt conserved more than 230 million acres of American lands and waters, establishing 150 national forests, 51 federal bird reserves, four national game preserves, five national parks and 18 national monuments





Today

- 568 National Wildlife Refuges
- 155 National Forests
- 16.43 million acres landlocked in the US

• 31 million acres of federal public land
